Wisconsin drivers pay 35% less than those in neighboring states.

The deteriorating condition of Wisconsin roads and the related costs to motorists have been well-documented. TRIP, a national transportation research group, estimates bad roads cost Wisconsin drivers \$6 billion a year, over \$2,000 per driver annually in Wisconsin's two largest cities, Madison and Milwaukee.

So it shouldn't be surprising that voters have reached the conclusion that it is better to pay a little more now to fix the roads than a lot more later to fix their vehicles.
