Public Works Certificate

Offered in cooperation with the Wisconsin Chapter of the American Public Works Association (APWA)

The Public Works Supervisory Academy certificate is composed of nine one-day courses (54 class hours in total). By earning the certificate, you have the opportunity to learn about and practice basic supervision and leadership skills in local public works organizations.

The Public Works Management Institute certificate is composed of 90 class hours total, including the nine courses in PWSA plus an additional 36 class hours that focus on more advanced management oriented courses. The PWMI is an APWA approved Public Works Institute. To enroll or get additional details about the PWSA and PWMI certificates, go to **interpro.wisc.edu/tic/public-works-certificates.**

You may enroll in individual classes without enrolling in the Academy or Institute. Students may take Academy and Institute courses in any order, however, the capstone course cannot be taken until all other courses have been completed. No academic experience is required to participate in either program.
