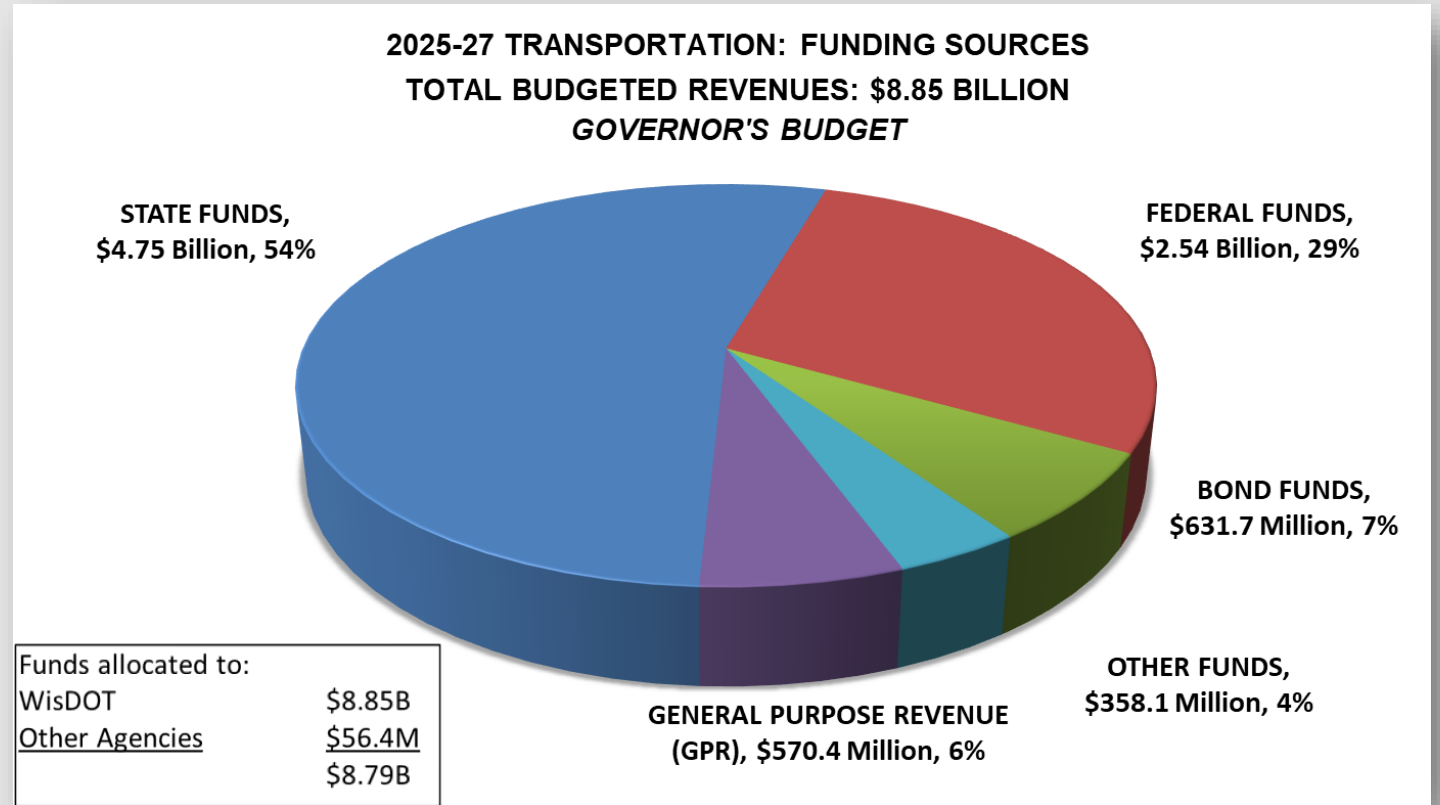
WisDOT Priorities

- Improved 8,600+ mi of roads, 2,000+ bridges since 2019
- Delivering 400+ highway improvement projects in FY25
- Priorities to build on progress:
 - Improve safety and mobility
 - Support construction workforce
 - Maintain continued investment in transportation
 - Deliver safe and efficient self-service tools



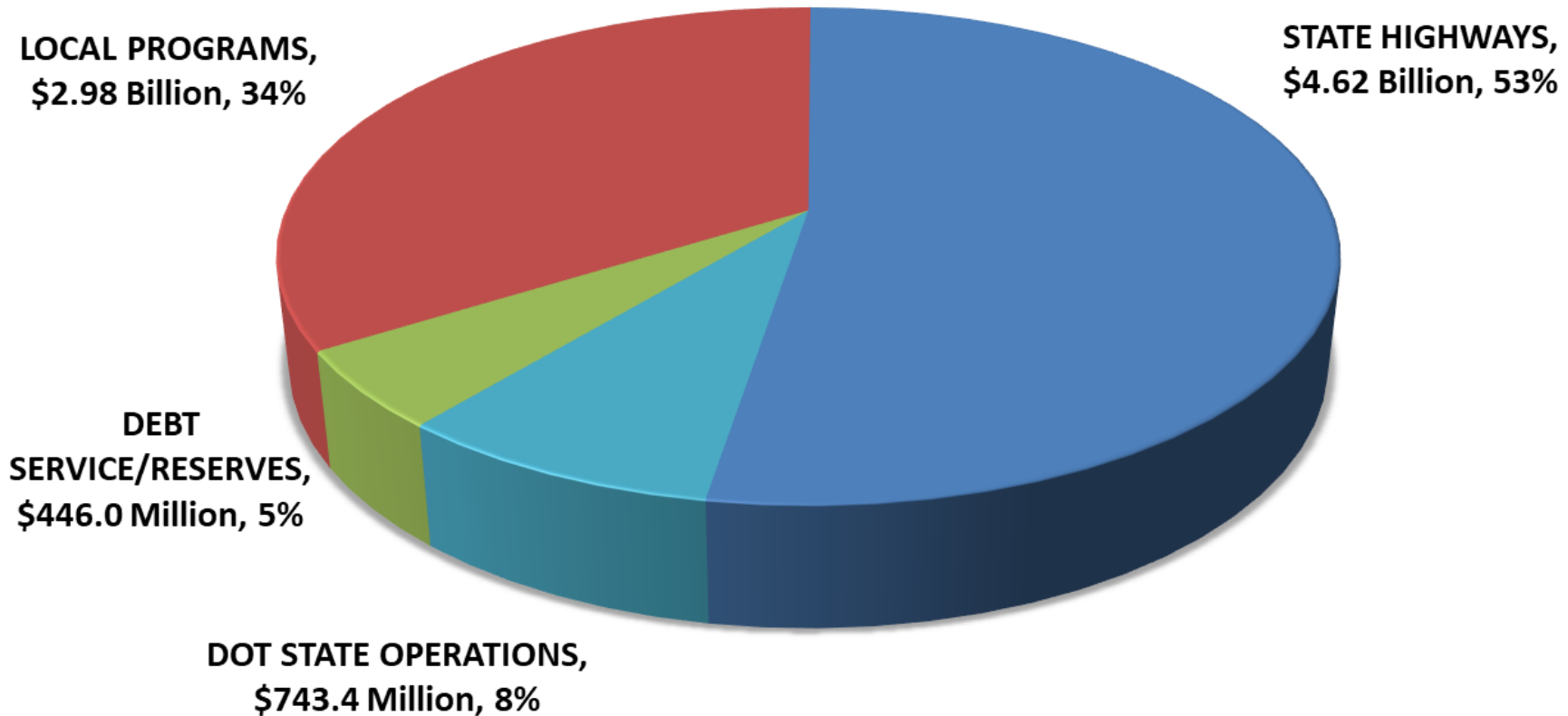
Transportation Budget Proposal

- 2025-27 governor's budget proposal:
 - Fourth in row to increase revenue
 - Strengthens programs, enhances funding opportunities



Transportation Budget Proposal

2025-27 TRANSPORTATION: ALL FUNDS
ALL FUNDS BUDGETED: \$8.79 BILLION
GOVERNOR'S BUDGET



Highway Program Funding

- 2025-27 budget proposal increases:
 - State Highway Rehabilitation – by 17.79%
 - Major Highway Development – by 33.62%
 - Southeast Mega Program – by 26.62%
- Funding request keeps current major projects on schedule
- Budget recommends enumeration of I-39/90/94 project



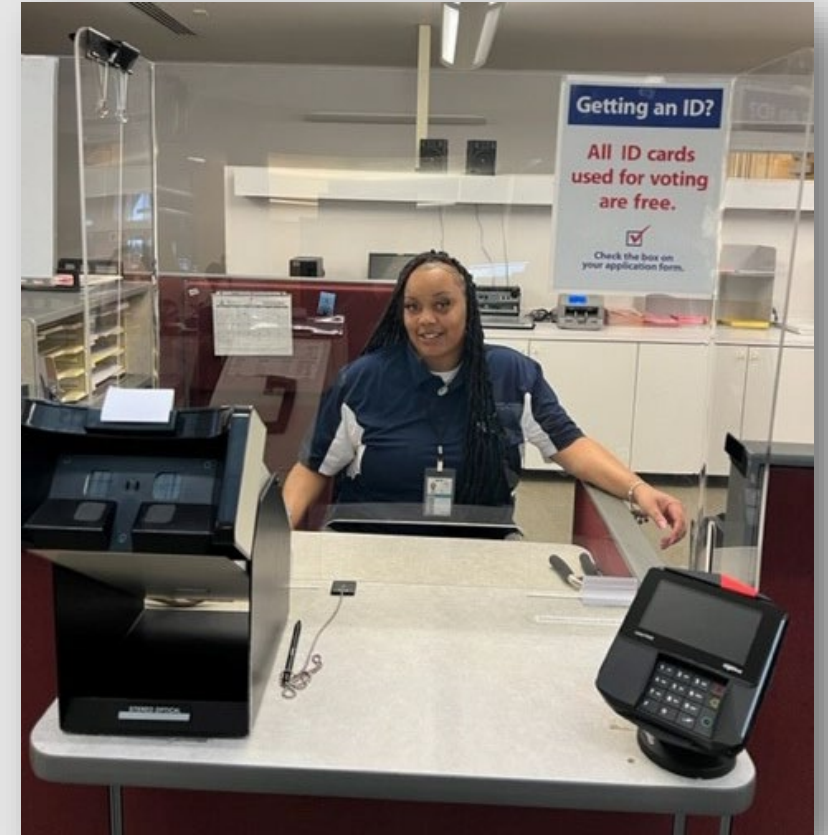
Multimodal Programs

- Budget proposal highlights:
 - GTA – 4% increase each year
 - ARIP - \$50 million
 - LRIP – 4% increase each year, \$100M for LRIP-S
 - Public transit – 4% increase annually
 - Rails/harbors – harbor & freight grants, passenger rail services



DMV Modernization

- Budget proposals for DMV services:
 - \$7.8 million in FY26, then \$7 million annually to modernize DMV software, applications
 - Goal: increase quality of DMV services and improve security of personal info
 - \$6 million annually to continue driver ed grant program



Significant Projects

- Ongoing projects:
 - Blatnik Bridge – Superior/Duluth
 - I-41 – Appleton to Green Bay
 - I-94 E/W – Milwaukee County
